Special Flyovers at 2022 CenterPoint Energy Dayton Air Show Presented by Kroger

(DAYTON, OH – July 12, 2022) – The CenterPoint Energy Dayton Air Show Presented by Kroger announced today the special appearance of three military aircraft – **U.S. Marine Corps CH-53 Super Stallion**, **U.S. Army AH-64 Apache**, and **U.S. Air Force E-3 Sentry (AWACS)**. The two helicopters will conduct flybys on both days; the AWACS will do a flyby on Sunday only. The air show will take place on July 30 and 31 at the Dayton International Airport.

The **USMC CH-53 Super Stallion** is a heavy-lift helicopter, designed for transporting up to 55 troops or externally slung loads of 36,000 lbs. – the equivalent of three very large elephants.

The **USA AH-64 Apache** has a vertical climb of 1,775 feet per minute and has been extensively used in night operations. The attack helicopter is most recognized by its helmet-mounted display and gun targeting system that moves with the pilot's head movement.

The **USAF AWACS** is an airborne warning, command and control system, easily recognized by the 30-footwide rotating radar dome atop the aircraft. The aircraft is an all-altitude, all-weather surveillance that can fly roughly eight hours without refueling.

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"The addition of these three aircraft in an already spectacular lineup is great news for this year's show," said Scott Buchanan, Chairman of the United States Air & Trade Show Board of Trustees, producers of the show. "Two of these three aircraft are going to be replaced in the coming years so we're excited that spectators get to see them before they're phased out."

The CH-53 Super Stallion, AH-64 Apache, and AWACS flybys will join an all-star lineup for the 2022 CenterPoint Energy Dayton Air Show Presented by Kroger. The show will be headlined by the U.S. Navy Blue Angels in their new F/A-18 Super Hornets and includes the U.S. Air Force F-16 Viper Demo Team as well as the U.S. Army Golden Knights Parachute Team. Also appearing will be aerobatic flyer Kevin Coleman, TORA! TORA! TORA!, an eight-plane emotional reenactment of the bombing of Pearl Harbor complete with pyrotechnics, the U.S. Air Force F-15 two-ship flyby and debut performances by Kent Pietsch Airshows and Vampire Airshows.
